Military Service

Michael was one of the crew of the Avro Lancaster Mk I (serial number LL902 EM-A) from 207 Squadron which took off at 1647 hours on the 14th March 1945 from Spilsby to bomb the Wintershall synthetic-oil plant at Lutzkendorf.

On its return from the bombing operation there was severe fog around Spilsby and the aircraft was diverted. However, whilst being diverted the weather deteriorated at the diversion site and the aircraft flew into the ground in severe fog near little Rissington Gloucester at 0250 hours whilst attempting to land at Little Rissington. Six crew died in the crash and the seventh (the rear gunner) died the following day in hospital.
