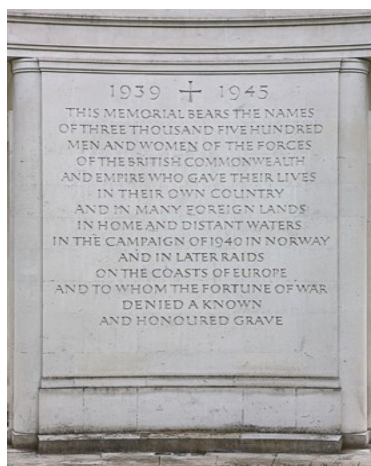
Military Service

At the time of his death Alfred was at sea on board the S.S. Benalbanach. The S.S. Benalbanach was part of convoy KMS6 and was bound for North Africa. The KMS series of mercantile convoys sailed from the UK to Gibraltar and onward into the Mediterranean.

The S.S. Benalbanach left the Clyde on Christmas Eve 1942, with a crew of 74 and 389 officers and men, as well as a cargo of tanks, motor vehicles, ammunition, petrol and general military stores. The returning convoy was attacked on the evening of the 7th of January 1943 East of Algiers by a single low flying German aircraft which released two torpedoes which hit the ship in No. 3 and No. 5 holds. The S.S. Benalbanach sank in less than two minutes with the loss of 57 crew and 340 Troops.

Colwall Connection

Alfred was born in Great Warley, Essex in 1911. At the time of his death his address was Vale View, Colwall. He was the son of John Jacob and Rosaline Maurer. Both his parents were Swiss nationals. His father, Jacob Maurer, was a celebrated alpine gardener and worked at Warley Place for Ellen Willmott for forty years. Alfred used to play cricket for Colwall.
