Leonard Graham Bendall is commemorated on the Leckhampton War Memorial

Leonard Graham Bendall was born in Cheltenham in 1892, the only child of Leonard and Matilda Bendall. His father worked for the Corporation as a labourer. In 1911 the family was living in Leckhampton, Cheltenham and Leonard Graham (recorded as Graham) was a domestic gardener. By the time he enlisted he was living in Colwall working as a gardener. He enlisted in Hereford and he joined the Herefordshire Regiment, going out with the 1st/1st Battalion in July 1915 to Gallipoli. He served with them in various locations and died of wounds in Palestine and is buried in Jerusalem War Cemetery. Raymond Barnett of Colwall is commemorated on the Jerusalem Memorial which is in the Jerusalem War Cemetery. Leonard Bendall is commemorated at Coddington and also the Leckhampton War Memorial where his parents were still living at the end of the war.
