

Donald Moss was born in Shelsey Beauchamp, Worcestershire in 1891 the son of Thomas and Mary Moss. He was one of twelve children and his father Thomas was an agricultural labourer and the family had moved to The Bungalow Colwall by 1901. In 1911 Donald was living with his parents at Hopyard and he was a railway porter. He enlisted in Malvern and joined the Grenadier Guards. He was killed in action during the Battle of Cambrai in November 1917 and he is commemorated on the Cambrai Memorial at Louverval. His sister Edith married Arthur George Smith who died on *HMS Gaillardia* in 1918.
